RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of Reverend Patrick Dolan at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

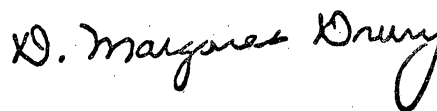

Rev. Patrick Dolan, 55, served in Brighton parish

The Rev. Patrick J. Dolan, who recently celebrated the 30th anniversary of his ordination, died Wednesday at Jeanne Jugan Residence in Somerville after a lengthy illness. He was 55.

Born in Boston, Father Dolan was raised in Cambridge. He attended St. Mary's Grammar School in Cambridge.

He graduated from Boston College High School in Dorchester.

Father Dolan then entered St. John's Seminary in Brighton. He was ordained May 29, 1968, at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston by Richard Cardinal Cushing.

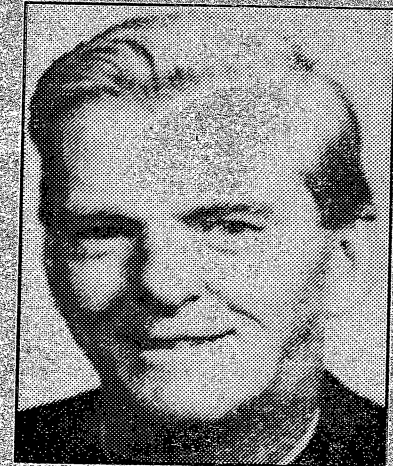
His first assignment was at St. Albert the Great Parish in Weymouth. He then served at St. Monica's Church in Methuen.

Father Dolan joined the Society of St. James as a missionary in the fall of 1974, serving in South America for five years.

He was assigned to Holy Name Parish in Rockland in October 1979.

Father Dolan was named parochial vicar of St. Columbkille Church in Brighton in May 1986. He retired in January 1997.

He had served as chaplain for the Knights of Columbus

Council 121 during his tenure in Brighton.

Father Dolan is survived by three sisters, Maureen Flumara of Medford, Theresa Shallow of Wells, Maine, and Eileen Philippon of Billerica; three brothers, Thomas J. Jr. of Cambridge, James J. of Medford and John of Revere; and many nieces and nephews.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 9 a.m. Monday at St. Mary's Church, Cambridge.

Burial will be in St. Joseph's Cemetery, West Roxbury.
