WHEREAS: The conclusion of the report reads as follows:

If you are someone who misses the old days, then drop into one of the new coffeeshops or restaurants. Taste Mary Chung's Suan La Chow Show or try a cinnamon scone at 1369 Coffeehouse. If you are a Generation X-er who just comes to Central Square for the late night music scene - then stop in at Harvard Donut early one morning for an egg and cheese on an english muffin with sausage for just \$1.99. Get a shave at John's, have your shoes repaired at Jimmy's, buy a wig at Venus, tutor at the library, learn to samba at the Dance Complex, buy fresh vegetables at the Farmer's Market, a shower curtain at Woolworth's, pick up oil paints at Pearl or fresh herbs from Haiti from Betty's Boutique. Host your own talk show at CCTV, play the lottery at Wiener's, catch the belly dancing at the Middle East, go to the World's Fair - all right here in Central Square;" now therefore be it
