In the year One thousand, eight hundred and sixty one.

An Ordinance
To establish a Cemetery fund. —

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows. —

Section 1. The board of Commissioners of the Cambridge Cemetery are authorized and empowered, on behalf of the City to receive and accept any sum of money which any person may by gift, legacy, payment or otherwise give or bequeath to said City for the purpose of keeping and preserving in suitable and proper condition and preservation any lot, tomb or grave in the said Cambridge Cemetery; — the acceptance of such gift, legacy or payment to be subject to the approval of the Mayor and Aldermen of said City — and when any such acceptance shall have been made and approved as aforesaid, such gift, legacy or payment shall be forever appropriated to the purpose aforesaid by the said City. —

Section 2. The said City shall not by virtue of any such acceptance or receiving of any such gift, legacy, payment or sum of money be holden or obliged to appropriate or in any way expend for or in keeping in proper and suitable condition and preservation any grave, tomb or lot in said Cemetery for which such sum of money may be given, paid or bequeathed as aforesaid more than the net income of such sum, and all such gifts, payments and bequests shall be accepted and received upon that condition or limitation —

Section 3. All sums accepted and received under this ordinance shall be paid over to the City Treasurer for the time being and by him kept as a distinct fund and called the Cemetery Fund, and the same shall be invested from time to time by the said Treasurer under the direction of ~~the~~ ^{the Board of Commissioners of the} Mayor, ^{Cambridge Cemetery} in such manner as they may deem expedient, and the said Treasurer shall report annually and oftener if thereto required, to the City Council the condition, amount and investment of said fund. —

Section 4. The net annual income of such portion of said fund as may be given by any person shall be

appropriated and expended in keeping, in proper and suitable condition and preservation such grave, tomb or lot in said Cambridge Cemetery as shall be designated by such person; the said lot, tomb or grave to be in all cases specifically designated when said gift or legacy or payment is made. If said income shall be more than sufficient for said purpose in any one year, the excess shall be added to the principal of that portion of the fund on which it accrues, until such time as the same may be necessary for said purpose. —
