It was a pleasure meeting with you today. I appreciate your enthusiasm for expanding recycling in Cambridge T stations. The City and the City's Recycling Advisory Committee remain very interested in seeing increased recycling opportunities for users of the MBTA in Cambridge.

During our meeting, you described several steps that you intend to take towards this goal. I have listed these below.

1. **Newspaper recycling:**

- Examine the trash collected in the Central Square T station to confirm that the quantity of newspaper thrown away warrants recycling bins in that station.
- Add the Kendall Square and Central Square (if warranted) stations to the Request for Bids for system-wide newspaper recycling services that you will be sending to potential vendors by early December.

2. **Beverage container recycling:**

- Talk with the T's Real Estate Division to determine whether it is feasible to involve the T's beverage vending company in any of the following: 1) providing bottle and can recycling receptacles on station platforms; 2) paying for transporting the bottle and cans to a processing facility; 3) paying processing fees for bottles and cans.
- Assess your cleaning company's capacity to transfer bottles and cans from recycling receptacles to toters and place the toters in appropriate places for collection.
- Talk with Save That Stuff about their capability to empty toters of bottles and cans and take the bottles and cans to KTI Recycling of New England, in Charlestown.
- Talk with Greg Appleton of KTI Recycling of New England (242-7746 x231) to inquire whether KTI would be able to process bottles and cans from the T at a reduced or no fee, either temporarily or permanently.
