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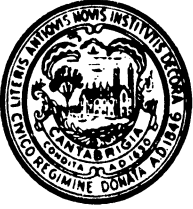

To The Honorable, The City Council:

I am hereby requesting the transfer of \$20,000.00 from the General Fund Employee Benefits Salaries & Wages Account to the Public Investment Fund Community Development Extraordinary Expenditures account to provide funds for additional testing at Russell Field and consultant support and community participation. This testing, which began in December, 1997, has found that surface soils do not contain chemical compounds above the reporting thresholds set by the State Department of Environmental Protection and do not present an imminent health hazard. Parkway Pond sediments were found to be contaminated in such a way as to require additional risk assessment which will be performed by the Metropolitan District Commission, the owner of the property.

The original sampling program for soil gas testing provided for ten locations. As a result of these tests, it has been determined that an additional five tests will be performed as well as routine testing at the proposed locations of the field house, tot lot, and community garden.
