A funeral will be held today for Alan E. Holber, a 52-year resident of Haverhill who owned Blake's Pharmacy. He died Thursday of cancer in Hale Hospital at the age of 81.

Born in Cambridge, he was educated in Malden and attended the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy in Boston.

Mr. Holber began his career as a chemist and a licensed pharmacist in Boston, Revere, Cambridge, and Salem. He was an Army veteran of World War II.

He had been co-owner of Haverhill Lumber and Building Supply Co., and owned Blake's Pharmacy until he retired in 1985. He was a member of Temple Emanuel in Haverhill and a former member of B'Nai B'rith and Emeth Masonic Lodge.
