The City Council has indicated they may provide to place each person providing testimony before the City Council under oath at the beginning of the hearing.

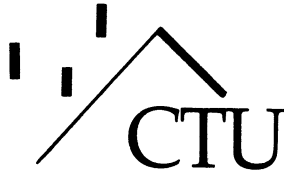

Yesterday morning, Stacie Marinelli, of the Cambridge Tenants Union Steering Committee, and I met with Mayor Vellucci to talk over the hearing before the City Council I have now requested twice (my Communications of 23 December 1987 and 7 January 1987). The subject of my requests had been the appearance and testimony of Ms. Jill Sullivan before the City Council on 7 December 1987 as well as the conduct of councilor Walsh both in the matter Ms. Sullivan discussed that evening and during the hearing itself.

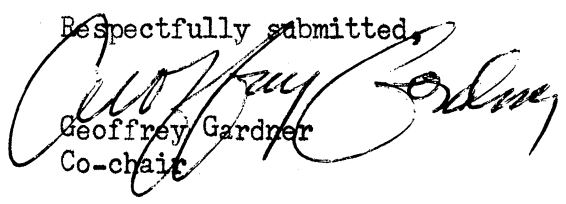
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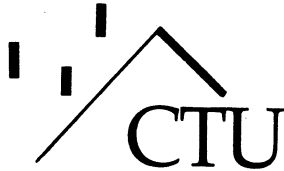
