- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of Peter R. Helwig on May 28, 1998 at the age of fifty-three; and
- WHEREAS: Peter grew up in Allentown, Pennsylvania and graduated from Dartmouth College in 1966; and
- WHEREAS: After graduation, Peter served his country in the Vietnam War; he was awarded the Bronze Star; and
- WHEREAS: After the war, Peter earned his master's degree in city planning from the Harvard Graduate School of Design; and
- WHEREAS: Peter began what was to be nearly thirty years of outstanding service to the City of Cambridge in 1969, when he was hired as planner in the Community Development Department; and
- WHEREAS: In 1982, Peter transferred to property tax assessment as director of residential valuation; he led the first effort in Cambridge to reassess all city property values in the wake of the changed state law requirements for full and fair valuation; and
- WHEREAS: Peter authored the Assessing Department's information booklet "Tax Facts," which received the Massachusetts Association of Assessing Officers' Public Information Award; and
- WHEREAS: In April, 1998, Peter was recognized by the Cambridge City Council for his outstanding service to the City and achievement as an employee; and

WHEREAS: Peter's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his wife Donna (Kline); his daughter Johanna of Boston; his son Alex of Flagstaff, Arizona, his mother Betty (Klotz) of Allentown, Pennsylvania; his brother Michael of Raleigh, North Carolina, and his grandson; and

WHEREAS: Peter will be sorely missed by all he touched and loved; now therefore be it

Peter R. Helwig, 53

Was Cambridge city planner

Peter R. Helwig, a Cambridge city government employee for nearly 30 years, died of colon cancer on Thursday at his home in Wellesley. He was 53.

Mr. Helwig grew up in Allentown, Pa. He went to Dartmouth College in Hanover, N.H., and graduated in 1966.

After graduation, he served in the Vietnam War and was awarded the Bronze Star. As base development officer, he was responsible for Army installations and planning and development.

After his Vietnam service, Mr. Helwig got his master's degree in city planning from the Harvard Graduate School of Design.

From 1969 to 1982, he was part of the Community Development Department of Cambridge and was recognized as one of the city's foremost city planners.

In 1982, Mr. Helwig transferred to property tax assessment as director of residential valuation. He led the first effort in Cambridge to assess all city property values.

He authored the Assessing Department's information booklet "Tax Facts," which received the Massachusetts Association of Assessing Officer's Public Information Award.

In April, Mr. Helwig was recognized by the Cambridge City Council for his outstanding service and achievement he rendered to the city.

Mr. Helwig leaves his wife Donna (Kline); a daughter Johanna of Boston; a son Alex, of Flagstaff, Ariz.; his mother Betty (Klotz) of Allentown, Pa.; a brother Michael of Raleigh, N.C.; and a grandson.

in 1952, he served on the staff of the Secretary of Defense at the Pentagon.

Dr. Philbrook was a member of the Randolph Board of Health for more than 40 years. He established public health clinics in Randolph and initiated a sewer construction project to curb the town's high incidence of polio.

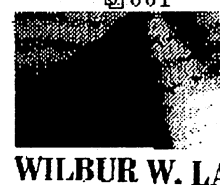
He was praised by Dr. Jonas Salk, creator of the polio vaccine, for his discovery of the effectiveness of single-dose immunization vs. three doses, which was initially believed to be an immunization requirement.

He served as state chairman of the March of Dimes for five years.

As director of research, training, and professional development with the state Department of Public Health, he was instrumental in using television as an instructional tool for the handicapped.

Dr. Philbrook was accepted as a member of the board of fellows at Norwich University and was inducted into the Military Order of the World Wars.

Dr. Philbrook's first love was music. He played the flute, organ, and carillon bells. He arranged and

Wilbur W. Lauer, a former executive and labor negotiator, died Tuesday at West Home in Westford. He was 78.

Mr. Lauer was born in Philadelphia. He attended Case Western Reserve College in Ohio, graduating in 1938 with a double major in psychology and business.

From 1942 to 1945, he worked for Shell Chemical Co., a pharmaceutical company that provided medical supplies to the war effort.

He and his family moved to Boston in 1962.

In Boston, Mr. Lauer was a labor negotiator for the United Farm Workers Co., later renamed the United Farm Workers of America, during the lettuce boycotts led by Cesar Chavez in the 1970s.

He succeeded in negotiating a contract that paved the way for the United Farm Workers to operate in the state.

Although he was on opposite sides of the labor issue, Chavez recognized Mr. Lauer's personal letter as "a man of his word" where many others were not.

During his 10-year tenure at Fruit, Mr. Lauer's company's poor performance in the Latin American market led to its closure.

In 1972, Mr. Lauer joined USM Corp. and became its group president in 1977.

Mr. Lauer leaves a wife, Lillian (Niswander); a daughter, Concetta; and two daughters, Patricia and Mary.

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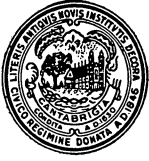
