Burial will be in St. Mary's Cemetery, Salem.

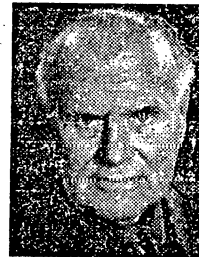

Harold 'Max' Bishop, 79,
retired sportswriter

Harold "Max" Bishop of Andover, a retired sportswriter for the Lawrence Eagle-Tribune, who had a passion for schoolboy sports, died Monday at Lawrence General Hospital. He was 79.

"He absolutely loved the kids," former Andover High track and football coach Dick Collins told the Eagle-Tribune. "I remember him calling the kids and they'd come back and say 'What a wonderful man he was. He was so interested in what we were doing.'"

Born in North Andover, he graduated from Andover High School.

Mr. Bishop was a World War II Navy veteran and served in the Pacific.

When he was released from the Navy, his baseball skills got him signed by the Red Sox and he was assigned to the farm team at Oneonta, N.Y.

For nearly 40 years, from 1955 to 1994, he was a sportswriter for the Eagle-Tribune, specializing in covering local high school sports. During his tenure, he urged the paper to increase its coverage of

girls sports.

In 1986, the Massachusetts High School Football Coaches Association awarded Mr. Bishop its media award. In July, The Eagle-Tribune named its schoolboy and schoolgirl athletes of the year awards the "Max Bishop Awards." He also coached Little League teams in Lawrence and was a radio announcer on WCCM.

"Nobody was more dedicated to sports that I know of," Joe Murphy, an Eagle-Tribune sports columnist and friend of Mr. Bishop for nearly five decades said in July. "He was all sports. That was his main interest. He was always trying to help the kids."

He is survived by his son, Scott A. of Foxboro; three sisters, Eleanor Dickson of Shreveport, La., Mary Ellen Jones of Groveland and Frances Stansfield of Haverhill; and two grandsons.

A funeral service will be held at 11 a.m. tomorrow at the Dewhurst and Conte Funeral Home, Andover.

Burial will be in Ridgewood Cemetery, North Andover.
