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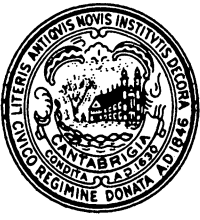

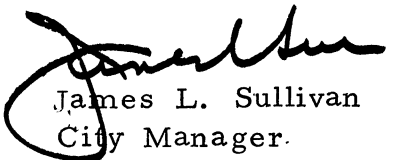
Attached please find proposed resolution in support of the City's application for \$20,000 under the "701" Community Planning and Management Assistance Program (U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development).

During the last two years the City has received \$60,000 from this source. The funds have been utilized to improve the City's financial management capabilities through the design of Financial Accounting and Management Information System (FAMIS) and implementation of this years program budgeting system. These projects responded to HUD guidelines which stressed improvement in executive management capabilities.

Revised guidelines for the upcoming year require the City's expected \$20,000 to be applied to comprehensive planning efforts. Thus we have applied for funding to augment our comprehensive planning program as follows:

1. Tabulation and analysis of mid-decade census information, including key punching, programming, and computer services (\$8,000).
2. Selective opinion and attitudinal surveys to gain broader input on particularly difficult issues and measure reaction to particular proposals (\$2,000).
3. Experimentation with innovative techniques for the dissemination of comprehensive planning information to the public (\$5,000).
4. The provision of specialized financial expertise to the development of plans and proposals, to insure that financial implications to the city are fully understood (\$5,000)
