IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

October 16th, 1894.

Whereas: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

W O R T H I N G T O N S T R E E T , so-called, should be laid out as a public street, the same being bounded and described as follows:

Noetherly by the northerly line of Worthington street about ~~305~~ three hundred and five and sixty-two hundredths (305.62) feet. Easterly by the easterly line of Lake View avenue fifty (50) feet. Southerly by the southerly line of Worthington street about three hundred and five and sixty-two hundredths (305.62) feet. Westerly by the easterly line of Lexington avenue fifty (50) feet. Containing fifteen thousand two hundred and fifty (15,250) square feet more or less.

Ordered,

That a strip of land fifty feet in width between Lake View avenue and Lexington avenue, as hereinbefore bounded and described, included between the red lines as shown on a plan drawn by L. M. Hastings, City Engineer, dated October 1, 1894, entitled "Plan of Worthington street for acceptance" and now before this Board, be and is hereby taken for public use and laid out as a public street, and the grade thereof established as shown by the red lines on the profile of said street, which is included in and is a part of said plan.

Ordered,

That no damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid, all the abutting lands on both sides of the street being owned by the City of Cambridge.
