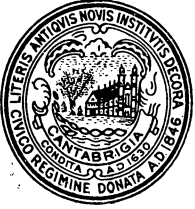

I hereby request an appropriation in the amount of \$403.53 to reimburse James A. Curtin, employee of the Cambridge Public Works Department, for damages in this amount.

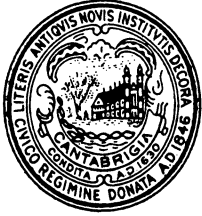
The Law Department, under the provisions of General Laws, Chapter 41, Section 100A, defended an action against James A. Curtin, in which there was a judgment of \$403.53.


To the Honorable, the City Council,
