Alfred E. Marckini was a graduate of the Federal Bureau of Investigation National Police Academy and was the recipient of eight different commendations for his outstanding police work and dedication to duty, and

Alfred E. Marckini represented the finest in law enforcement and was a dignified, faithful and impartial law enforcement officer and earned the respect of all those who came in contact with him,
