- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened to learn of the death of Sister Irene Good, RSCJ, after a long illness; and
- WHEREAS: Sister Irene Good, a native Cantabrigian, graduated from Newton College of the Sacred Heart in 1950 and began her teaching career as a lay-teacher at the Charles Taylor School in Boston and later entered the Cambridge Public School System as a teacher at both the Webster and Morse Schools from 1950 to 1959, at which time she entered the religious order of the Sacred Heart; and
- WHEREAS: Sister Irene professed her vows in Rome in 1967 and subsequently taught in various parochial schools in Philadelphia, New Jersey, New York and Maryland; and
- WHEREAS: She obtained Master's degrees from both Boston College and Manhattanville College of the Sacred Heart, demonstrating her true commitment to education; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire Good family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Good family on behalf of the entire City Council.
