The Metropolitan Area Planning Council has recently completed a Watershed Protection Plan for the Hobbs Brook and Stony Brook Watersheds, which provide the public drinking water supply for the City of Cambridge. The Watershed area includes portions of Waltham, as well as Lexington, Lincoln, and Weston. The project includes an assessment of existing and potential threats to the drinking water supplies, and a set of recommendations for action to protect those valuable resources. The recommendations include actions by local governments such as zoning amendments, site plan review requirements, and local ordinances to control hazardous materials and underground storage tanks, among others.

At the Public Meeting, there will be a presentation which summarizes the Watershed Protection Plan and its recommendations, and an opportunity for questions and comments from city officials and interested citizens. Please plan to attend and pass the word on to others in the community.
