

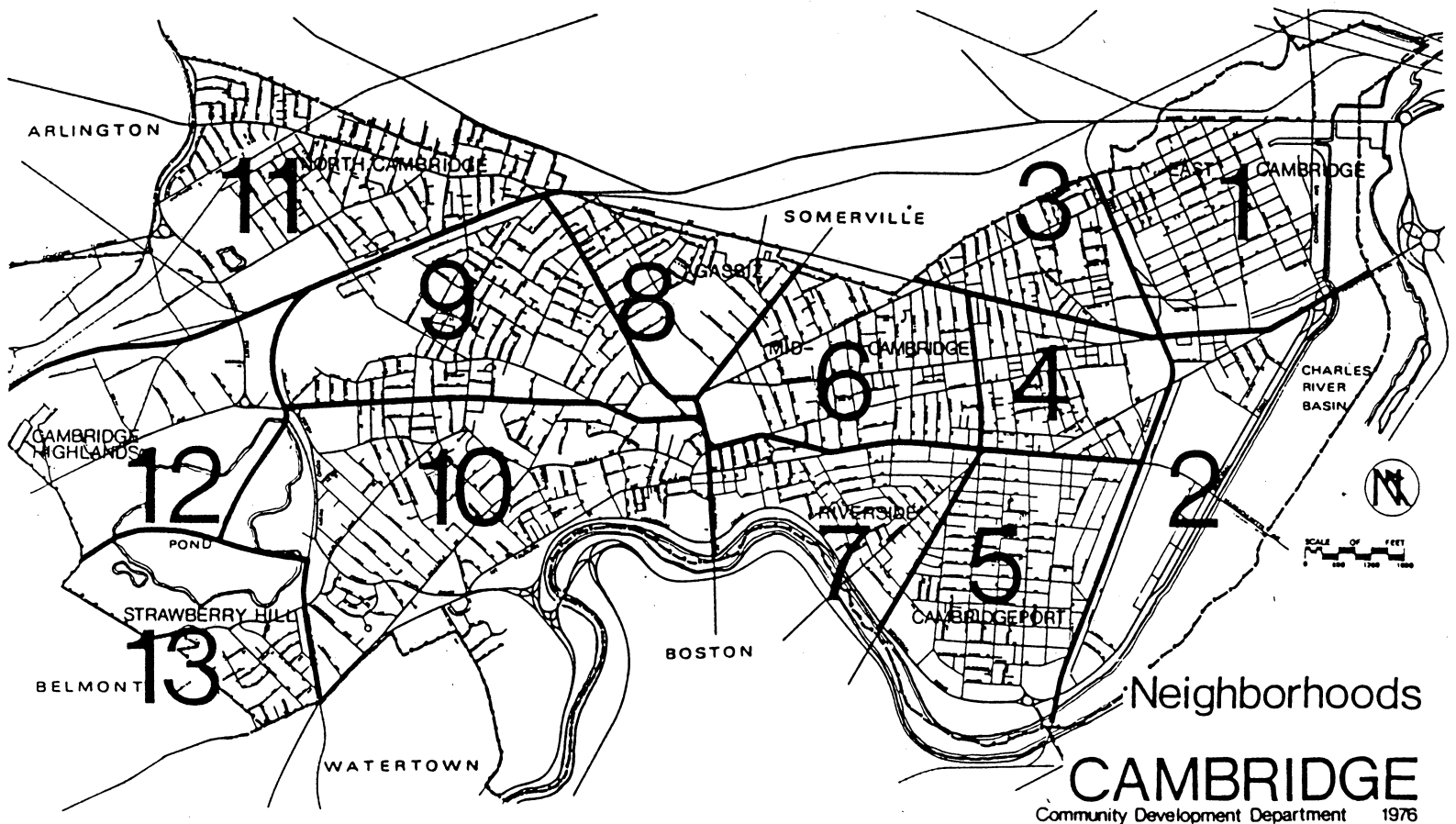

1980 CAMBRIDGE POPULATION  
NEIGHBORHOOD, RACE AND SPANISH ORIGIN STATISTICS

The Bureau of the Census has released provisional race and Spanish origin population figures for Cambridge from the 1980 U.S. Census. The final totals may differ if lawsuits challenging the accuracy of the Census counts are successful.

The chart on the back of this page shows population totals for Cambridge neighborhoods by race groups and by Spanish/Hispanic origin. Since "Hispanic" is not considered a race, all persons of Spanish origin were also included in one of the listed race groups. Nationwide, 56% of persons of Spanish origin marked their race as "white", 40% indicated "other" (and specified Puerto Rican, Chicano, etc.) and 4% marked one of the other groups. In the 1970 Census, Hispanics who indicated "other" were classified as "white"; in 1980, their race was left as "other".

PRELIMINARY NEIGHBORHOOD ANALYSIS

CAMBRIDGE POPULATION - 1980 U.S. CENSUS

I. OVERVIEW

The release of data gathered during the 1980 census has been tantalizingly slow, particularly around the kind of neighborhood based information that is so valuable for determining human service needs. The purpose of this report and the attached tables is to make some data available on a neighborhood basis for fall planning needs. The information selected and the types of analysis attempted have been formulated from a human services perspective -- what do we as public and private agencies, citizen boards, and community groups need to know to bring out services into line with the current realities of the population of Cambridge neighborhoods, to document needs for our proposals, and to plan for the future?

A variety of general trends in the census data have been highlighted elsewhere. Cambridge's overall population has dropped 5% from 100,361 in 1970 to 95,322 in 1980. The composition of that population has changed more dramatically; the total minority population (including Hispanic) has increased from 10% to 20%. During the 1970's, the city's black population increased 54% while the white population declined 14%. The number of single person households has increased from 32% to 50%, while the number of households with four or more people dropped from 20% to 14%. More than a third of Cambridge children live in single family homes, most headed by a woman. In general, Cambridge women with children are more likely to work than their counterparts in the rest of the country (59% to 50% nationwide).

Cambridge residents are more likely to be single than the entire U.S. population (52% as opposed to 26%); less likely to be married (31% as opposed to 57%); and equally likely to be divorced, widowed, or separated. There are fewer children under 18 (16% as opposed to 28%) and more of the 25-34 year old age group (26% as opposed to 16%). Persons living alone account for 42% of households in Cambridge, though only 23% in the nation as a whole, but that type of household grew at a much slower rate in Cambridge during the seventies than it did nationally. The number of families has dropped by 16% over the last ten years; married couples families showed the greatest losses, of course, while single parent families, female and male, increased some. That latter increase, however, was not as rapid as the increase in such households nationwide; those households now comprise the same share of all households in both Cambridge and the country as a whole.

The attached tables cannot speak yet to the issue of how each neighborhood has changed -- more data is required from the Census Bureau for that level of analysis. They do attempt to provide a snapshot of each neighborhood in some specific areas as of 1980. Despite the thickness of the attached tables, a great deal more work needs to be done. This document is intended in large part to stimulate further discussion in the human services community in the city about the kind of information and the kind of analysis needed. Our second goal is to lay the statistical groundwork for the planning and discussions which will point to service directions for the next decade.

## II. TECHNICAL CONSIDERATIONS

The available census data has the odd characteristic of being both too much and too little. On the one hand, the data extrapolated from the long form questionnaire is extensive and can be analyzed and re-analyzed in almost endless combinations. On the other, there are significant restrictions inherent in the data available -- determined in part by the questions that were asked and in part by the tables developed by the Census Bureau. The goal of the attached tables is to highlight information that will immediately be useful to the human services community.

Since data is not yet available from the Census Bureau on a neighborhood by neighborhood basis, the following tables have been developed by grouping appropriate census tracts, according to neighborhood boundaries. This technique presents a sound profile of each neighborhood and has, in fact, been used for all neighborhood based information developed in the past. The technique does necessitate taking the two partial census tracts that make up Neighborhood 12 and assigning them to Neighborhoods 9 and 13. Neighborhood 12 has a total population of just 691.

Information on age and race is drawn from the short census form. All other tables are based on that sample of the population which completed the long questionnaire. In 1980, just under one in every five households received the long questionnaire. The tables developed on the basis of the sample are somewhat more prone to error. Another factor affecting the precision of each table is the decision by the Census Bureau to suppress data which could violate the confidentiality of respondents. Suppression occurs most frequently in the smallest unit of analysis, the block group, but can also occur within a census tract. Suppression also generally explains instances in which totals on different tables which should be the same do not compare precisely.

Finally, the Census Bureau has indicated that they have identified some coding areas in the data now released to the city, particularly in income information and that on linguistic ability. Therefore, these tables should be used with caution. Corrected information will be released in the fall of 1983.

## III. ANALYTICAL APPROACH

The census provides information about individuals in the city, about households, and about families. The tables attached emphasize information on individuals and families because it is our view that these are the constituencies of most concern to the human services community. Within the context of the census, a family is defined as two or more individuals, related by blood or marriage, living together as a unit. In fact, it is important to bear in mind when looking at information on families that of the 95,322 residents in Cambridge, only 54,031 or 57% live in family households. Any analysis based on families does fail to account for the 28,857 residents (30%) who live in non-family household and the 12,434 residents (13%) who live in group quarters, including student dorms. Specific tables have been included that highlight the characteristics of those non-family households comprised of elderly residents.

Some of the tables rely on percentages, others on total numbers, and still others on both. In each instance, an effort was made to determine whether a particular characteristic had greater implications in terms of the overall composition of a neighborhood (such as educational levels) or in terms of the absolute demand for services (such as the number of individuals in each age group who do not speak English well). In many instances both seemed important and percentages

often prove particularly useful in making comparisons across tables. Percentage distributions across neighborhoods have not been emphasized since the wide variations in total population size of neighborhoods can distort the significance of those numbers.

Finally, many of the tables provide specific information on residents and/or families of Spanish origin. The census data readily supplies such information; within Cambridge, however, there are two other significant linguistic communities, the Portuguese and the Haitian, which also command our attention. It is important to keep these other two communities in focus, despite their apparent absence from the census tables.

## TABLES. 1 - 5. GENERAL DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS OF CAMBRIDGE RESIDENTS BY NEIGHBORHOOD.

Though Cambridge's total population declined 5% from 1970 to 1980, each neighborhood, with the exception of Cambridgeport (Neighborhood 5), experienced population changes that were different from the experience of the city as a whole and quite different from each other. Some of those distinctions have a ready explanation; for example, the substantial population growth in Neighborhood 13 is largely attributable to the construction of Huron Towers. Others represent the total impact of a variety of different factors.

The age composition of the various Cambridge neighborhoods clearly highlights the impact on a neighborhood of the presence of group quarters -- the large percentage of 18-21 year olds in Neighborhoods 2 and 7. The tables also confirm the large proportion of children in Neighborhoods 3 and 4, as well as the significant ratio of senior citizens resident in East Cambridge and in West Cambridge. With both those populations, it is also important to keep in mind that while percentages may be higher in particular neighborhoods, absolute numbers can be larger in others. For example, there are 579 residents who are 65-74 years old in Neighborhood 1, who represent 11% of the total neighborhood population. In Neighborhood 6, only 6% of the population falls into that age group, but the total number of individuals is 907.

Previous documents drawn from the 1980 census have noted overall occupational trends in the city. In the 1960's, the city divided up roughly into thirds: 34% professional; 33% skilled, semi-skilled, and unskilled white collar workers; and 33% blue collar and service workers. Though the occupational analysis was done along somewhat different categories in 1980, some striking changes are clear. Professional workers now constitute 40% of the workforce while blue collar workers have dropped to 17%. Neighborhoods 1, 3, and 4 represent the most significant deviation from the city-wide trend toward larger proportions of professional workers; Neighborhoods 8 and 10 reflect far higher proportions of such professionals. Neighborhoods 5, 11, and 13 seem to approximate most closely the distribution of occupational groups that prevailed in the 1960's. The profile of educational attainment in the city goes hand in hand with the occupational one: three times as many residents have completed college or beyond as have completed only elementary school, for example.

## TABLE 6. FAMILY INCOME

The family income tables describe by race and Spanish origin, the numbers of different families at various income levels and the average income in each neighborhood. The table does not control for family size, and so cannot speak directly to issues of income adequacy.

In every neighborhood, the average income of white families is somewhat higher than the average income for the neighborhood as a whole. In every neighborhood, except Neighborhood 6, the average black family income is lower than the neighborhood as a whole, as is the case with Hispanic families with the exception of one Neighborhood. The relationship between black and Hispanic family incomes varies from neighborhood to neighborhood.

## TABLES 7 and 8. FAMILY HOUSEHOLDS BY TYPE

In every neighborhood, married couples without children outnumber those with. In general, only about forty per cent of married couples have children; in Neighborhood 6, this number drops to less than thirty per cent. City-wide about 30% of all family households with children are female-headed, though this number ranges by neighborhood from 60% in Neighborhood 4 down to 19% in Neighborhoods 2,3, and 8.

In analyzing family households by race and Spanish origin, more distinctions arise. City-wide, 26% of all white family households with children are female headed, while 46% of such black families are headed by a woman as are 43% of such Hispanic families. On the other hand, neighborhood differences are equally notable. In Neighborhood 7 for example, 45% of white families with children are female-headed, but only 30% of black families with children are headed by a woman. In Neighborhood 11, among white families with children, only 22% are female headed, but among such black families, over 60% are headed by a woman. Among Hispanic families, absolute numbers are so small in each neighborhood that percentages need to be used with caution. Moreover, in focusing on female-headed households, it is important not to ignore those 314 families city-wide which are headed by a single father.

A different table speaks to the number of all women with children who are and are not in the labor force. In general, among women with children under 6, the similarity in percentages in the labor force are more notable than the differences across neighborhoods. That 50% in the labor force when their children are under six appears to rise to almost 70% as the children enter school-age. Several cautions should be used with this table. Women with children over and under 6 may be double-counted; moreover, the numbers count the number of women, not the children involved. Finally, the age-grouping of 6 to 17 is extremely broad.

## TABLES 9 and 12. POVERTY STATUS

Poverty status for the purposes of the census was determined by comparing total 1979 income to an income cut off or "poverty threshold." In 1979, that threshold was \$3,774 for a single person under 65 and \$3,479 for one over 65. A family of four (two adults and two children) was at poverty with an income of \$7,356; a family of five (one adult and four children) was at poverty with an income of \$8,525.

Among all Cambridge residents, the poverty rate is 15%. That rate rises to 29% for Hispanics and is at 19% for blacks. Rates vary among neighborhoods as does the relationship in some instances among whites and blacks and Hispanics. The poverty rates for family households is 12% for non-elderly headed units and just 6% for those headed by an elderly individual. However, for the large number of non-family elderly households, the poverty rate jumps to 16% and the proportion of such non-family to family household is high.
