Dear Sir:

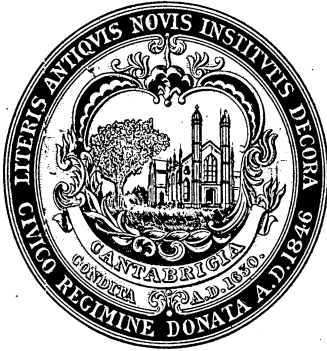
