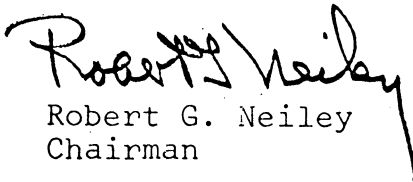
To owners of property in the vicinity of Phillips Brooks House,
Harvard Yard, in the Cambridge Common Historic District:

The Cambridge Historical Commission has received from Harvard
College an application for a Certificate of Appropriateness
for the following exterior alterations to Phillips Brooks
House:

Installation of anodized aluminum storm windows on the
exterior of all window openings, the color to be an off
white to match the existing window casings.

Under the provisions of the Historic District Act, General
Laws Chapter 40 C, Section 12, the Cambridge Historical Com-
mission may dispense with a public hearing on this application
and proceed to issue a Certificate of Appropriateness for the
proposed alterations, provided that the alterations are deemed
to be insubstantial in their effect on the Historic District
and that ten days' prior notice is given to the owners of
adjoining property and of property deemed to be materially
affected by such alterations. We deem the effect of the
alterations described above to be insubstantial and your
property to be among those materially affected.

Should you have any objection to the issuance of a Certificate
of Appropriateness for the proposed alteration at Phillips
Brooks House, Harvard Yard, please notify the Cambridge His-
torical Commission at the above address within ten days.
