

In the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty three.

An ordinance,

In addition to an ordinance, to prevent unlawful and injurious practices in the streets and other public ~~streets~~ ^{places} in the city.

Be it ordained, by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows. The Mayor and Aldermen, or such person as they may authorize thereto, may grant a licence in writing to any person, for the purpose of building or other lawful purposes, to enclose, obstruct, or encumber so much and such parts of any street, lane, alley, sidewalk, or other public place in the City, and on such terms and conditions, as they shall deem safe and proper.
