Schools and School-Houses.

April 3-1861.

City of Cambridge.

In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred & Sixty, one.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:—

Sect. 1. The third section of the Ordinance in relation to Schools, page 150 of the Ordinances of 1857, is hereby repealed.

Sect. 2. The Mayor and Aldermen shall employ suitable persons to keep the Schoolhouses of the City clean and in good order, and properly warmed and ventilated; and who shall also render such assistance to the Committee on Fuel as that Committee may, from time to time, require.
