IMR TELECOM

The Department of Public Utilities has opened an investigation into the operations of IMR Telecom ("IMR") regarding the provision of operator service from coin operated telephones ("COCOT"). IMR is engaged in providing pay phone services in Massachusetts. IMR has not obtained a certificate from the Department to provide these services, and has not filed rates for these services with the Department. The Department has reason to believe that, through the use of technology that allows for recording, storing, and polling operator assisted calling information, IMR is providing operator services in Massachusetts that require the issuance of a certificate of public convenience and necessity by the Department and the approval of rates filed with the Department.

Investigation by the Department of Public Utilities on its own motion into allegations contained in the Notice of Probable Violation issued by the Department on August 18, 1989, that IMR Telecom is providing telecommunications service within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts without a certificate of public convenience and necessity and without an approved tariff for such services.
