5. To hire both lay and professional personnel as staff of said institution of learning who are qualified to teach emergency medical techniques through their backgrounds in medicine and/or emergency medical technology.

6. To employ, develop, and adapt text materials, training aids, and other related equipment and personnel in teaching said program of formal education.

7. To affiliate said institution of learning with various hospitals, other institutions of learning, and/or other emergency-medical-care organizations toward the end of creating opportunities for practical training of students enrolled in the program of formal education.

8. To enter into contracts with other institutions of learning: municipal and/or town organizations, including, but not limited to, police departments and fire departments; private organizations, including, but not limited to, ambulance service organizations; and, other interested organizations and individuals for the purpose of making available to such organizations and individuals the services of the corporation's formal education program.

9. To seek and accept financial support from all sources, including, but not limited to, tuition payments from students enrolled in said program; Federal and State and Local Government agency sources; contributions from private corporations and/or individuals, in furtherance of the above purposes.

10. To receive and administer funds exclusively for educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax law), and to that end to take and hold by bequest, devise, gift, grant, purchase, lease, or otherwise any property, real, personal, tangible or intangible, or any undivided interest therein, without limitation as to amount or value; to sell, convey, or otherwise dispose of any such property; to invest, reinvest, or deal with the principal or the income thereof in such manner as, in the judgment of the directors, will best promote the purposes of the Corporation without limitation, except such limitations, if any, as may be contained in the instrument under which such property is received, these Articles of Organization, the By-Laws of the Corporation, or any laws applicable thereto.

11. To do any other act or thing incidental to or connected with the foregoing purposes or in advancement thereof, but not for the pecuniary profit or financial gain of its directors or officers.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows: In recognition of the great public need for the establishment of a uniform standard of competency of those technicians involved with the initial management of the acutely ill or injured or incapacitated, the incorporators of this corporation do form said corporation with the following specific purposes in mind:

1. To establish and maintain an institution of learning for the education and training of students in the emergency medical care of the acutely sick, injured and incapacitated.

2. To provide a program of formal education of sufficient depth and duration aimed at satisfying the above-stated need with an ultimate goal of achieving vocational status for emergency medical technicians, so that the public may be assured that all emergency medical technicians who have completed said program shall have progressed to acceptable prescribed levels.

3. To establish requirements for the successful completion of said educational program.

4. To grant certificates to those students who successfully complete said educational program.

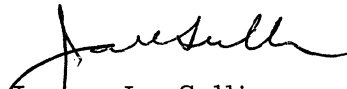
