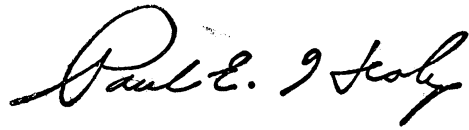

- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that Building Commissioner Charles F. Sprague has retired from active service in the City of Cambridge, completing thirty-six years of public employment; and
- WHEREAS: Charles Sprague was born in Cambridge, attended local schools graduating from the former Rindge Technical High School in June of 1936 and served our country during 1942-1945 in the United States Navy Reserve; and
- WHEREAS: Throughout his life "Charlie" never stopped educating himself attending and completing a series of comprehensive educational extension courses at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Wentworth Institute of Technology, Northeastern and Harvard University among others, where he studied business law, architectural drawing and engineering; and
- WHEREAS: "Charlie" first went to work for the City of Cambridge in 1945 as a Carpenter in the Building Maintenance Department, a position he held until 1950 at which time he was promoted to Building Inspector, a position he held until 1963 when he was promoted to Superintendent of Buildings/Building Commissioner the position from which he retired July 30, 1981; and
- WHEREAS: Commissioner Sprague has also been active throughout his life in many civic and fraternal organizations such as the Kiwanis Club where he served as President and Director, Knights of Columbus #74 where he is a Past Grand Knight as well as a past President of St. Mary's Holy Name Society and past President of the Massachusetts Building Inspectors Association; and
- WHEREAS: "Charlie's" good nature and long years of experience will be greatly missed by his many colleagues and friends through the City of Cambridge; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our sincere appreciation and gratitude to Commissioner Charles F. Sprague for his dedicated and continued public service for a total of thirty-six years; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare for presentation a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution on behalf of the entire City Council.
