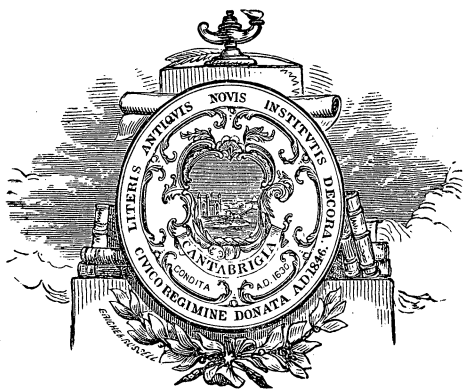

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

May 19. 1885.

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

Webster Avenue, so-called,
extending from Plymouth to Windsor Street

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land

in width between fifty feet
said Plymouth and
Windsor Streets

included between the red lines as shown on a plan drawn by C. D. Elliott
Civil Engineer, dated September, 1876,

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that no damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid,
