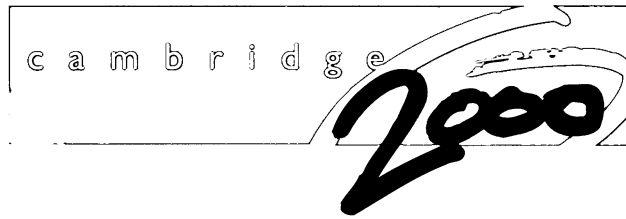

To The Honorable, The City Council:

I am hereby requesting the transfer of \$73,111 in the General Fund from the Schools Salary & Wages Account to the Schools Travel & Training Account (\$14,397) and Extraordinary Expenditures Account (\$58,714).

The Travel & Training Account funds will cover a projected shortfall required to cover a lump sum worker's compensation settlement and workshop stipends. The Extraordinary Expenditures Account funds is required to cover elementary school furniture requests, CRLS science lab equipment, and replacement refrigeration equipment for the Culinary Arts program.

It should be noted that this transfer is being submitted to the School Committee for approval on June 15, 2000 and I will notify the City Council on Monday, June 19, 2000 if the School Committee approved the request.
