Louis A. Lopes, at 78, retired federal clerk

Louis A. "Foots" Lopes of Cambridge, a retired federal clerk and former semipro baseball player, died Monday at Cambridge Hospital. He was 78.

Born in New Bedford, Mr. Lopes was a longtime Cambridge resident.

He worked as a clerk for the federal government in Boston for many years until his retirement in the early 1970s. After his retirement, Mr. Lopes worked for the Cambridge Meals on Wheels program and delivered meals to elderly and disabled neighbors.

Known to teammates as "Foots," Mr. Lopes played semipro baseball for many years and was a coach for several Cambridge youth teams. An avid musician, Mr. Lopes spent many years as a

drummer for the Creole Star Dusters, an amateur band that performed creole music throughout New England.

Mr. Lopes is survived by two daughters, Charlotte and Doreen, both of Cambridge; two sons, Louis "Butchie" Jr. and Vincent, both of Cambridge and Caesar of New Hampshire; three sisters, Dominga Andrade and Lillian Royster, both of Cambridge, and Adeline Cruz of New Bedford; and many grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. tomorrow at St. Mary's Church, Cambridge.

Burial will be in North Cambridge Catholic Cemetery, Cambridge.
