In Board of Aldermen, June 19, 1871-

Whereas certain persons whose land has been taken for public use and laid out as a part of the public streets or ways, claim the right to remove such portions of the soil as they see fit from the land so taken, thereby making excavations in the street and rendering it necessary to fill up such excavations, at considerable expense, in order to make the street safe for public travel, ^{thus} adding considerably to the sums awarded for the land taken for public use, -

Ordered, That the Superintendent of Streets be directed to give notice to any persons making such removal of earth to desist from making the same, and to require any amounts taken and the cost of filling such excavations, that such expense may be ~~deducted~~ ^{recovered} from the sums awarded ~~thereon~~ recovered from them.
