City of Cambridge Dec 2. 1868.

The Committee to whom was referred the petition of G. B. Ryder & others asking that nine feet of Land the whole depth of the Public Park on the westerly side may be thrown into the passage way have attended to their duty and would report that the act of the Legislature approved April 29th 1865 concludes as follows:

"said ground shall be surrounded by enclosures and shall forever remain unused as a public street, unoccupied by any building and open as a public park" which as interpreted by the Committee would prevent the taking of any land to be put into the passage way or street.

Your Committee having already appropriated the amount of money voted for improving the Park cannot ~~effect~~ warrant in placing an iron fence upon the westerly side at an increased expense of some eight hundred dollars and would ask to be discharged from any further consideration of the petition.
