The Committee on Printing hereby invites proposals for printing and binding 1200 copies of the Annual Reports of the Committee on Finance to be made in December, 1883, with the accompanying documents and such other documents as shall be ordered to be printed together with the Inaugural Address of the Mayor-elect. Said documents to be printed under the supervision of the City Clerk, and under the direction of the Committee on Printing. The proposals and contract aforesaid to include all the documents ordered to be printed, whether bound together or separately, and to conform to the following specifications:

- 1st. The pages of type to be of the same size as the Mayor's Address and Annual Reports made in December 1882, as per sample copy herewith, and the same general style to be followed, excepting in those portions where the Committee on Printing may suggest condensation or other changes.
- 2d. No charges shall be made or allowed for any alterations in the type, except for such as may be made necessary by changes in the original copy and ordered to be made by the City Clerk or the Committee on Printing, after the type has once been set up. All changes thus ordered shall be entitled to charge. If desired by the Committee, a marked book, showing the places where the alterations charged for were made, shall be furnished the City Clerk.
- 2d. The type-setting of the whole or any part of these Reports, Documents, and Address shall be charged for but once; and the type shall be kept standing without charge, for the printing of such copies of said Reports, Documents, and Address as may be ordered printed and bound separately, until the Committee on Printing decide that it is no longer needed for such use. But the Committee shall not require the type to be kept standing for this purpose a longer time than one month. All title-pages, or other additional matter not used in the complete book, but required to be set up for these separately printed documents, and the time occupied in altering, reimposing, and preparing the type for the printing of these separate documents, shall be considered subject to charge at the same rates provided for in this contract for the complete book.
- 4th. The presswork shall be well done, with good black book ink, in forms of sixteen pages. Any fractional part of sixteen pages made necessary in printing shall count as if sixteen pages of presswork.
- 5th. The paper shall be 24x38 inches in measurement, white laid, and 60 lbs. per ream in weight, and shall be fully equal in quality to that in sample book above alluded to.
- 6th. Binding to be in paper covers, as thick and of same color as sample above alluded to. The books shall be well sewed, no stitching, and trimmed to 5-7-8x9-1-4 inches.

Agreeably to above specifications, your estimate is desired in items as follows:

Price per 1000 ems for type-setting.
" " " " rule and figure work of 3 columns.
" " " " rule and figure work of over 3 columns.

[All under 3 columns to be charged as plain matter.]

Price per hour for changes in type.
" per token of 500 impressions of 16 pages; (anything less than 500 impressions may be charged as a full token.)
" per ream for paper.

" of binding per copy, if not exceeding 400 pages; in paper covers.

" binding same in cloth covers, with gilt stamp on side. Dies to be furnished by the city.

" of additional cost of binding for each signature of 16 pages over 400 pages.

The bill for the work, when done, shall be rendered in separate items, to correspond with the above estimate. It shall be made out in detail, specifying the number of pages of each kind of types, and accompanied by a marked copy of the book, showing where these pages of each kind of type may be found in the book. This is for the convenience of the Committee in quickly approving the bill.

The return of this printed slip with prices plainly written against each item and with the signature of the contracting parties there to shall be considered as a sufficient contract for the faithful performance of the work.

The proposals for the above to be sealed, and opened only in full committee. The Committee reserve the right to reject any or all bids received.

Proposals must be sent to the undersigned, on, or before THURSDAY, December 27th, at 6 o'clock P. M. The whole work must be finished and delivered to the City Clerk on or before the 1st of March, 1884, with bill for the same.
