His passing will be sorely felt by the members of his family, his many friends and an entire generation of Harvard athletes, therefore be it

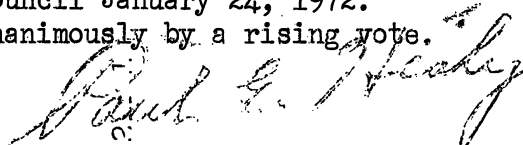
RESOLVED:-
