Whereas,

The Board of Aldermen, on Dec. 8th, 1884, granted the petition of William Lawrence and others, to the effect that the city would accept a plank sidewalk, paid for and to be laid by residents on Brattle street, from Brattle Square to Craigie Street, - and also lift and relay said sidewalk in the spring and autumn of each year, and the petitioners thereafter proceeded upon the assumption of a contract with the city,

it is

Ordered,

That the Committee on Roads and Bridges be authorized on behalf of the city, to sign an agreement with said William Lawrence and others, that the city will not own the said plank sidewalk to be permanently removed, for the term of five years from the date of such agreement.

Provided, the said William Lawrence and others, will on their part agree to take back said walk, keep it in repair, and lift and relay the same in Spring and Autumn, all at their own expense, and to the satisfaction of the Committee on Roads and Bridges of the Board of Aldermen, and the Superintendent of Streets.
