- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of the Reverend Gunnar Haugh; and
- WHEREAS: Father Haugh, a former parish priest at St. Mary's in Cambridge, was a delayed vocation, having served the Cambridge School Department for many years as both a teacher and administrator; and
- WHEREAS: Prior to entering the Pope John XXIII Seminary, he was the Master of the Webster School, now known as the Graham and Parks School, and while serving as Master deeply involved himself in the curriculum and educational programs for the benefit of the schoolchildren; and
- WHEREAS: Father Haugh is a veteran of World War II, having served in the United States Air Force, and upon being honorably discharged, pursued an academic career, obtaining degrees from Boston College, Columbia University and Boston University and after entering the seminary obtained yet another degree, a Master's of Divinity; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of the late Reverend Gunnar Haugh at this time of such personal sorrow; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
