WHEREAS: Alexander was the third generation of his family to lead what is now the Beal Companies, one of the oldest real estate, investment and consulting firms in Massachusetts, one with significant Cambridge holdings and history. The company is now led by his two sons; and

WHEREAS: Alexander was raised in Brookline; he attended Lehigh University and graduated from Harvard College in 1931; and

WHEREAS: Alexander served his country in the United States Navy during World War II; and

WHEREAS: Alexander was an active Republican who worked as an organizer for Dwight D. Eisenhower's Massachusetts presidential campaigns and Christian Herter's gubernatorial campaigns; and

WHEREAS: Alexander was active in charitable and civic affairs throughout his life; he was a trustee of Beth Israel Hospital, Grove Hall Savings Bank, president of Temple Ohabei Shalom in Brookline, a director of the Boston Municipal Research Bureau and Graham Junior College; after moving to Florida in 1979, he was chairman of the Palm Beach Zoning Commission and treasurer of the Palm Beach Symphony; and

WHEREAS: Alexander was the husband of the late Leona Rothstein; and

WHEREAS: Alexander's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his wife Jane (Franklin) Beal; his sons Bruce A. and Robert L. Beal; his three stepchildren Frank and Lynn Hirsch and Susan Bowker; his five grandchildren; and one great granddaughter; and

WHEREAS: Alexander will be sorely missed by all he touched and loved; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of Alexander S. Beal at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Beal family on behalf of the entire City Council.

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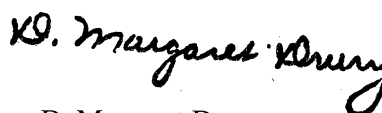
