- WHEREAS: The Cambridge City Council has designated the year 1980, the 350th Anniversary of the Founding of Cambridge, as the year to celebrate the coming of the members of the Massachusetts Bay Company to Newtowne to establish a seat of government, and has urged that the year 1980 be devoted to activities in observance of this deed; and
- WHEREAS: The same Cambridge City Council has called upon the Cambridge 350th Committee and all Cantabrigians to use this occasion to recall the great heritage and love of freedom that our Founding Fathers brought to the shores of the Charles; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge 350th Committee has proclaimed Saturday, October 4th as the day of The Small Ships Celebration and The Re-Enactment of the Founding of Newtowne, and Sunday, October 5th as the day of the Founders Parade; and
- WHEREAS: Many followers of the sea have demonstrated a willingness to participate in The Small Ships which will escort the launch carrying the official re-enactment party, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City of Cambridge express its gratitude to the Sailors of 1980 who carry on the tradition of the Sailors of 1630 in their concern for our fundamental freedoms, protection of our waterways, and conservation of our natural resources.
