MAYOR WOLF

WHEREAS: In recent years we have seen a steady erosion of financial support from the state; and

WHEREAS: The Commonwealth of Massachusetts has traditionally borne the cost of the employer's share of teachers' retirement costs, but the proposed FY1992 state budget initiates an assessment on cities, towns, and regional school districts equal to 10% of the cost of retired teachers' pensions; and

WHEREAS: This sum represents approximately \$424,035 for which Cambridge would not be reimbursed; and

WHEREAS: Cities and towns cannot continue to take on the state's responsibilities; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council opposes section 210 of the proposed FY1992 state budget, House No. 1 and urges our state legislators to vote against it; and further be it

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be sent to our state legislators.
