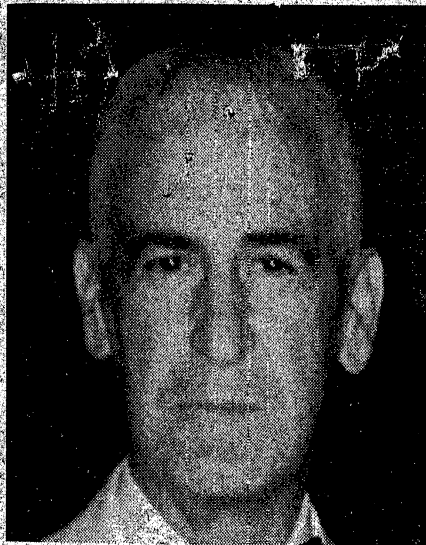

John P. Farricy, 90

Longtime BC High teacher

John P. Farricy of Braintree, whose teaching style graced classrooms at Boston College High School from the middle years of World War II until 1985, died of emphysema Wednesday in South Shore Hospital in Weymouth. He was 90.

Mr. Farricy joined the faculty of the Jesuit high school in 1943 as an instructor specializing first in physics and, for the long run, in mathematics. Two years ago, in recognition of his long dedication to the education of thousands of students, he was given the school's Ignatius Award for outstanding service to the school.

Mr. Farricy's long and productive working life mirrored that of many teachers of his generation. Graduating from college as the Great Depression spread across the land, he found that teaching alone would not support a growing family. So while continuing on to graduate school and beginning to teach, he joined the US Post Office and worked there until 1960 when he retired as an inspector of registered mail.

Mr. Farricy was born in Boston. He graduated from Boston College High School and Boston College, where he also earned a master's degree in the classics. He also studied at Holy Cross College and Clark University under the auspices of a federal science award.

He leaves his wife, Mary Katherine (Walsh); two sons, John P. of Northborough and Michael J. of Brewster; a sister, Mildred Brophy of Quincy; and three grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said at 9 a.m. tomorrow in the chapel at Boston College High School. Burial will be in Howard Cemetery in Northborough.
