- WHEREAS: On the fifth day of February, 1981 death brought to a close the active life of Frank R. Barbera at the age of seventy-three years; and
- WHEREAS: Frank R. Barbera, a dedicated family man, a longtime resident of Rindge Avenue, who was active in community affairs and devoted many of his leisure hours to the development of athletic programs for the youth of North Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: His dedication to athletic and active interest in North Cambridge Division of the Little League was recognized by his elevation to the Presidency of that organization where he served so long and so well for many years; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Mayor and the City Council of Cambridge does, by this resolution and public record, recognize the profound influence of Frank R. Barbera on the civic life of Cambridge and the development of athletic programs for the youth of Cambridge and further recognizing that his death is a distinct loss to the City where he worked and won deep respect and affection; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager of the City of Cambridge be requested to make the necessary presentation for a ceremony to be conducted in the spring at which time a suitable bronze plaque be placed at Comeau Field to record for all time the contributions made by Frank R. Barbera to the youth of Cambridge; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That this resolution be spread upon the minutes at this City Council and a copy thereof be sent to his wife, Helen, in recognition of Mr. Barbera's place in this community.
