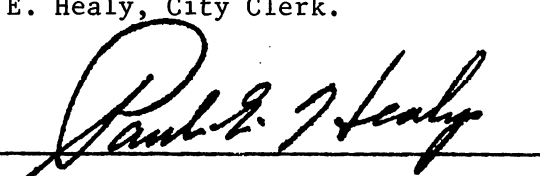

- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that on Tuesday, May 21, 1985 while playing golf at the Fresh Pond Golf Course, Richard Stanton, a long time Cambridge resident, living on Huron Avenue, suffered a heart attack; and
- WHEREAS: Playing directly behind Richard was another long time resident from Gurney Street, Mr. Edward McAuliffe, who upon witnessing Richard collapse rushed to his side and began to administer cardiac pulmonary resuscitation (CPR), providing another breath of life to Richard, who although he unfortunately passed away a few days later, he and his family could have comfort that someone was at his side almost immediately; and
- WHEREAS: This kind of quick humanitarian response should not go unnoticed by this City Council; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deep appreciation to Mr. Edward McAuliffe for his quick response and effort in attempting to save the life of another human being; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mr. McAuliffe on behalf of the entire City Council.
