By Car

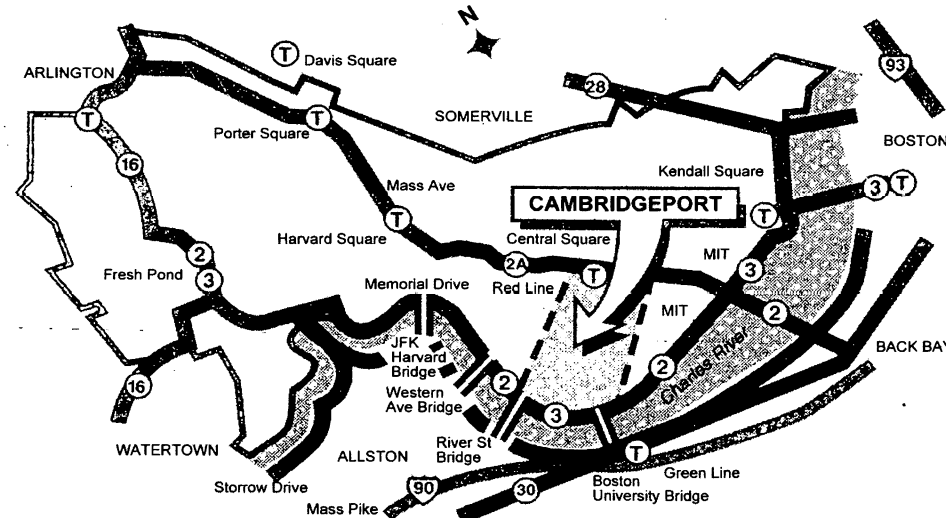
