PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

Kevin Benjamin has been with Stull and Lee, Inc. since 1992. His twenty years of experience includes ten years of private practice as principal of Benjamin Associates, Inc. He has served as Project Designer, Project Architect and Project Manager on institutional, commercial, and transportation-related projects. As Director of Information systems, having implemented the firm's CADD system; although he no longer has primary responsibility for the firm's computer systems, he remains a major resource for information management and computer-based design, documentation and 3D visualization.

Currently, Mr. Benjamin is serving as Project manager and Architect for a 38,000 sf (including a 12,000 sq. ft addition) to an office building in Roxbury. Part of an effort by the Massachusetts DCPO to relocate state-administered human resources closer to the communities they serve. This structure, which began as a neighborhood supermarket, requires careful integration into the residential fabric of its surroundings.

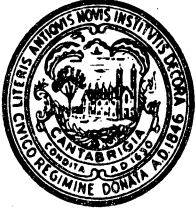
