MAYOR VELLUCCI

- WHEREAS:** The City of Cambridge has consistently taken the lead among cities in addressing at a local level the need for citizens to be aware of the dangers of nuclear war and to seek ways to work for peace; and
- WHEREAS:** The City of Cambridge established the Cambridge Commission on Nuclear Disarmament and Peace Education for the purpose of educating all the citizens of Cambridge on the issues of nuclear war and of peace; and
- WHEREAS:** The Cambridge Commission on Nuclear Disarmament and Peace Education has been charged with reaching out to children and adult citizens in all neighborhoods of the city in the performance of its task; and
- WHEREAS:** The Cambridge Commission on Nuclear Disarmament and Peace Education has happily accepted its mandate to work throughout the City, seeking ways to reach as many people in as many ways as possible; and
- WHEREAS:** Cambridge has an annual River Festival that has established itself as a beloved tradition, bringing the people of Cambridge together to share their joy and pride in their City and its gifts; and
- WHEREAS:** The Cambridge Commission on Nuclear Disarmament and Peace Education and the Cambridge Arts Council have joined forces to create the groundwork for a Peace Arts Festival on the afternoon of Sunday, June 12, 1983 as part of the summer-long River Festival program to include performances and activities including musicians, dancers, singers, poets, writers and graphic artists, and exhibits of writing and drawings on themes of peace by Cambridge school children; and
- WHEREAS:** June 12, 1983, is the first anniversary of the day declared for all of the citizens of Cambridge to evacuate to New York to rally for world peace; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That, I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge proclaim June 12, 1983 as "Peace Arts Day" in the City of Cambridge and invite all the citizens of Cambridge to join in the Peace Arts Festival on Sunday, June 12, 1983, at Riverbend Park to celebrate the creative spirit of our city and its people and to dedicate themselves to making a peaceful world for themselves and their children.
