(more than six months ago) and awards were made to the
owners of the land taken. An award was made to the petitioner
which he has drawn from the city treasury. The street is

abutting thereon so that surface water in a wet time
~~run~~ runs from the street upon his land and stands
upon the floor of the building and for this he seeks

compensation. He has no legal claim. All this in the
natural result of the laying out of Harding street and
