Union Street  
between Market and Hampshire Streets,

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land <sup>thirty</sup>  
<sup>feet</sup> in width between Market and Hampshire  
Streets,

included between the <sup>red</sup> lines as shown on a plan drawn by W. A. Mason for  
Engineers and Surveyors, and dated October 1881,

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that <sup>no</sup> damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid,
