WHEREAS: This City Council has already passed a resolution endorsing the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child; and

WHEREAS: This treaty asserts the right of all children to develop to their full potential, assuring them full access to food, shelter, health care, and education, as well as freedom from the ravages of war, sexual exploitation, and other abuses; and

WHEREAS: To date, 80 countries have ratified this treaty and another 55 have publicly signaled their intentions to do so, but the United States is the only major western democracy not to have signed the treaty; and

WHEREAS: President Bush's refusal to sign this treaty shamefully places the United States in the company of such countries as South Africa, Iraq, Iran, and Libya which have international reputations of abuse; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council urges President Bush to endorse the United States Convention on the Rights of the Child; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be sent to President Bush.
