COUNCILLOR CRANE

- WHEREAS: There is an obvious and confirmed report of severe pollution in "Little Fresh Pond"; and
- WHEREAS: The body of the water is separated from the city's drinking water only by a ten foot wide emergency road; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to cap the 12 inch overflow pipe connecting the storm relief sewer with Little Fresh Pond, the 60 inch storm relief sewer connects the Mt. Auburn section of Cambridge with the MDC storm sewer in back of the Sancta Maria Hospital; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the storm relief sewer be cleaned and flushed for the first time in forty years; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the Water Department and/or the Public Works Department inspect the storm relief sewer to determine the location and number of sanitary sewer connections; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City install the necessary connections at the pump house located on the emergency road in order that unpolluted water be made available to the Recreation Department activities in this area; and be it further
- ORDERED: That since time is of the essence this work should be performed through a "crash program" with private contractors in necessary.
