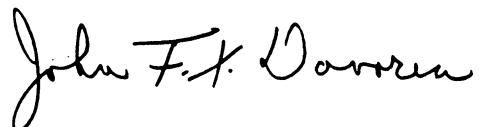

1. The name by which the corporation shall be known is:

Black Student's Scholarship Fund, Inc. ✓

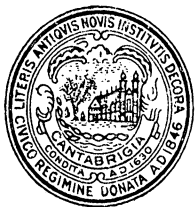
2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows: a.) To provide, maintain and give incentive to Afro-American students at Boston State College who are in financial need, and who wish to pursue their educational goals. b) To let the Boston State College Black Student Body know that we, as a people are trying to help provide our own financial support and aid will be given annually. c) To foster a tighter solidarity in reaching our educational goals. d) To establish the pattern of each student lending or reaching out to help other Black students. e) Provide guidance and counseling for persons who seek or need educational assistance. f) Provide assistance in the establishment of scholarship programs.

And to have and to exercise all rights, powers, and privileges which may now or hereafter be conferred by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts upon corporations formed under chapter 180 of Massachusetts General Laws, to provide and promote any and all activities proper and necessary to achieve the foregoing ends. To purchase, sell, rent, mortgage, or otherwise acquire or encumber real estate and cordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Ch. 180, Sec. A, receive by gift, bequest, or otherwise, and to invest or reinvest, expend, convey, or otherwise dispose of such funds, personal or real property, and to solicit public or private contributions, no part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefits of any individual, all in such a manner and at such time and times and upon such terms as may be necessary, proper, or desirable for the accomplishment of any of the foregoing purposes, none of which include activities carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence

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legislation, or participation in, or intervention in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. It is intended that the organization described herein shall be entitled to exemption from federal income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as now in force or hereafter ammended so this corporation shall not have or exercise any power of authority either expressly, by interpretation or by operation of law, nor shall it directly or indirectly engage in any activity that would revert this corporation from qualifying and continuing to qualify as a corporation described in Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, contributions to which are deductible for Federal Income Tax purposes. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to the members, directors, officers or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for service rendered and to make payments and distribution in furtherance of the purposes set forth above. In the event of termination, dissolution, or winding up of the corporation in any manner or for any reasons whatsoever, its remaining assets, if any, shall be distributed to one or more organizations described in section 501 (C) (3) of the aforementioned code.

The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by the Board of Directors. The number of directors shall be no fewer than three nor more than seven. The members of the corporation shall be persons who from time to time are elected to membership by the Board of Directors.

Pursuant to a communication from the Secretary of State re: "Black Student's Scholarship Fund, Inc.," I made an investigation.

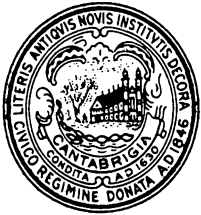

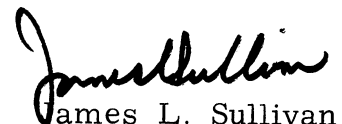
