WHEREAS:-

This City Council learned with deep regret of the passing of Dr. Henry D. Chadwick on March 21, 1969, and

WHEREAS:-

Dr. Henry D. Chadwick graduated from Harvard Medical School in 1895 and began the general practice of medicine in Waltham, which practice he continued until stricken with tuberculosis in 1907, and

WHEREAS:-

Following his recovery he determined to dedicate his life to finding a cure for tuberculosis and served as Superintendent of the Westfield State Sanitarium for nearly two decades and conducted the Chadwick Clinic to treat children stricken with tuberculosis, and

WHEREAS:-

Dr. Henry D. Chadwick served as Commissioner of Public Health for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts during the years 1932 to 1938 and served as a Medical Director at the Middlesex Sanitarium and Superintendent of the Cambridge Sanitarium prior to his retirement in 1946, and

WHEREAS:-

Dr. Chadwick was the recipient of honors from the Massachusetts Thoracic Society and served as past president of the Massachusetts Tuberculosis Association and co-author of the book entitled "Modern Book on Tuberculosis" which was published in 1942, therefore be it

RESOLVED:-

That this City Council go on record recording their sorrow at the passing of this distinguished man of medicine, and be it further

RESOLVED:-

That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the family of Dr. Henry D. Chadwick.
