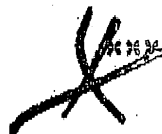

At 78, Rev. Antonine De Guglielmo, scholar

The Rev. Antonine De Guglielmo, OFM, an official of the Franciscan order, died Thursday at the St. Bonaventure Friary in Brighton after a long illness. He was 78.

Rev. De Guglielmo was born in Cambridge. A renowned scripture scholar, he pursued graduate studies at the University of St. Anthony in Rome and the Franciscan Biblical Institute in Jerusalem.

Upon completion of these studies he earned the degrees of doctor of sacred theology and lector of sacred scripture.

He was an ordained priest of the Catholic Church for 56 years.

From 1938-45, Rev. De Guglielmo was a professor of sacred scripture and biblical language at the theology department of St. Francis Seraaphic Seminary in Andover. He continued to teach from 1946-52 at the theology faculty of Mount Alvernia Seminary in Wappingers Falls, N.Y.

Rev. De Guglielmo returned to Rome from 1952-54 to finish requirements needed to earn a degree of doctor of sacred scripture.

In 1955 he was elected provincial definitor of the Franciscan order and in 1957 was elected general definitor. As general definitor he served as adviser to the superior general and member of the governing board of the order.

As an expert in Semitic languages he served as an associate editor and translator for the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine from 1947-57.

In 1970 the translation of the New American Bible was published with the help of Rev. De

Guglielmo and 51 other scholars.

He worked as a parish priest at Our Lady of Peace Church in Brooklyn, N.Y. and the St. Leonard's Church in Boston's North End.

Rev. De Guglielmo also served as editor of the Chronicles of the Order for the Province of the Immaculate Conception.

He is survived by four sisters, Mary Frisoli, Lillian Ferraro and Joan, all of Cambridge, and Frances Tingle of Revere; two brothers, Robert and Walter, both of Cambridge; and many nieces and nephews.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated for Rev. De Guglielmo at 10 a.m. Monday at St. Francis of Assisi Church, 325 Cambridge St., Cambridge.

Burial will be in Franciscan Cemetery, Andover.
