Please be advised that the Public Works Department has increased its maintenance personnel assigned to patching potholes for the past six weeks, and will continue to do so until the good weather is upon us.

I am sure everyone realizes this winter has been one of the worst on record. And the prolonged cold weather, accompanied by the ice and snow has deteriorated road conditions in Cambridge, and every other place in New England.

The Public Works Department has had crews working Saturday and Sunday patching potholes, and many instances at night when we have received a complaint that seemed to be an emergency.

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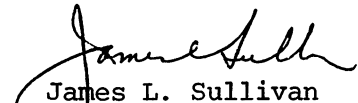
