IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT

EXEMPTING THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE FROM THE PROVISIONS OF
CHAPTER 111C OF THE GENERAL LAWS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the
authority of the same, as follows:*

SECTION 1. The provisions of Chapter 111C of the General Laws, and
the regulations promulgated thereunder, shall not apply in the City
of Cambridge to any publicly owned vehicle of the City of Cambridge
and operated by its police or fire departments in the rendition of
emergency medical and ambulance services.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of The Commonwealth of Massachusetts
in General Court assembled.

The undersigned, citizens of City of Cambridge respectfully
petition for the passage of the accompanying bill or resolve, and/or for legislation Exempting the City
of Cambridge from the provisions of Chapter 111C of the General Laws.

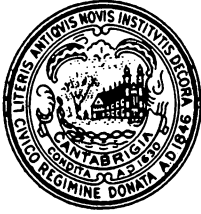
